Medium-Sized Businesses (MSBs) are defined as companies with turnover between £25m and £500m.

# WHY DO MSBs MATTER?

Evidence demonstrates MSBs disproportionately contribute to economic growth. Therefore, increasing the numbers and size of Scotland's midmarket is critical to achieving sustained economic growth.

KEY FACTS

- MSBs are found in every sector and industry across the economy.
- 2 MSBs have higher levels of productivity.

An additional 320 MSBs

in Scotland since 2010.

An additional 32,610 jobs

in Scotland since 2010.

An additional £12.7bn in

turnover since 2010.

- They are also more likely to be innovation active.
- 4 MSBs are more likely to have greater gender balance in leadership.
- Offer apprenticeships at a higher rate than other firms.
- 6 Employees have higher levels of satisfaction.


Structure of Scotland's MSB activity 2019, by


